John D. Callaway, TV news anchorman, radio talk show host, documentary producer, network news executive, and author, will speak on "The Art of Interviewing: The New Contact Sport." Mr. Callaway co-anchored and directed the "Callaway-Ruddle Report" on WTTW, spent sixteen years with CBS radio and TV in Chicago and New York as an executive and broadcast newsman, won thirty awards for his documentary and "Nightline" programs for WBBM-CBS Chicago, and served as vice president for CBS Radio from 1968-1970. In his twenty years as a journalist he has done on-the-scene coverage of everything from crime in Chicago to war in the Middle East, reported on six national political conventions, contributed articles to many periodicals, and co-authored *Action in the Streets*, a book on juvenile delinquency.

Martha Wright, a very versatile lady whose talents lie in many areas, will review the book *Six Men* by Alistair Cooke. Mrs. Wright, who holds a bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin, a master's degree from Northwestern University, and who did three years of graduate work at the Sorbonne in Paris, began book reviewing in Westchester County, New York. After returning to the Chicago area she taught French for fourteen years at New Trier East. In addition to teaching and book reviewing, she has worked with theater and choral groups.

Alma Washington, talented actress, narrator, and model, will present "A Sketch of Ethel Waters." This dramatic interpretation of portions of the life of Ethel Waters, covering vaudeville, night clubs, Broadway reviews, and straight dramatic roles, has both its light and its more serious moments. Excerpts from plays are interspersed with many of the songs which she made famous. Miss Washington's acting career, which began in productions at Roosevelt University, includes community theater, industrial films, commercials, and television productions.

Priscilla Ruegg, authority on American Decorative Arts, will present a slide program entitled "Queen Anne Meets Thomas Chippendale" in which she will lead you through colonial rooms and teach you to identify and appreciate American furniture of the 18th century. Mrs. Ruegg, who trained at the Henry Francis DuPont Winterthur Museum in Delaware and the Philadelphia Museum of Art, worked for seven years at the Philadelphia Museum as a Park House Guide. Since moving to Chicago in 1976 she has been on the teaching staff of New Trier Extension Continuing Education.

Because of her intense desire to improve her life, she began studying — Psychology, philosophy, theology, fashion — and eventually she earned a doctorate in metaphysics from a correspondence college in Kansas. From her ISIS center in Chicago, she works to bring peace and harmony to many students who seem always to begin in doubt, but end in understanding.
